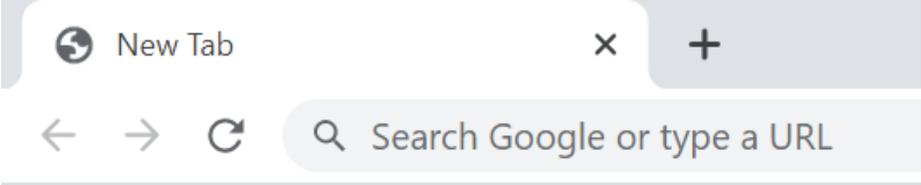


How do I...

Create a Gmail e-mail

1	<p>Open the internet browser of your choice. Examples include <i>Mozilla Firefox</i>, <i>Yahoo!</i>, and <i>Google Chrome</i>.</p>	
2	<p>Find the address bar at the top of the browser. Left click in the search bar and type <u>gmail.com</u>. Press the Enter button on the keyboard to be directed to the site.</p> 	
3	<p>On this sign in page, look for the blue text that says Create account. Left click once on this button.</p>	
4	<p>First, you need to enter your first and last name. You can use an alias or nickname, as long as both the first and last name spaces are filled in.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Create your Google Account</p> <p>Then choose a username for your e-mail address. 5	<p>Next, create a password. Strong e-mail passwords:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do not contain personal information • Are more than eight characters long • Contain uppercase and lowercase letters • Contain at least one symbol <p>To make sure your password looks correct, left click in the Show Password box to view it before you finalize it.</p>	

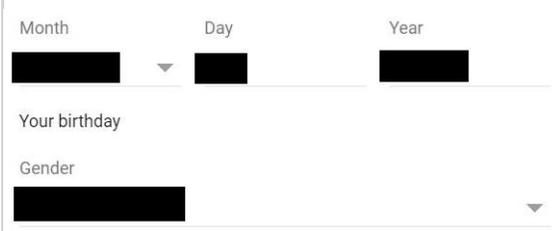

Google will send a text message with a 6-digit verification code. <i>Standard rates apply</i></p> <div style="display: flex; align-items: center;"> <div style="border: 1px solid #ccc; padding: 5px; flex-grow: 1;">Phone number</div> </div> </div> <div style="flex: 1; padding-left: 20px;"> <p>Now that you've got an e-mail address, Google will need to verify that you're the person setting up the account.</p> <p>On this page, enter your phone number to get a text or call that will verify you are the one creating the account.</p> <p>Once you enter your number, click Next.</p> </div> </div> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-between; margin-top: 10px;"> Back Next </div>
7	<div style="display: flex;"> <div style="flex: 1;"> <p>Once you enter your number and click Next, you will get a text from Google with a 6-digit code. Type it in to verify your account.</p> <p>If you would prefer to have a call to complete this step, click on the Call instead option next to the Verify button.</p> </div> <div style="flex: 1; padding-left: 20px;"> <p>Verify your phone number</p> <p>For your security, Google wants to make sure it's really you. Create a Gmail e-mail

8	<p>Almost there! On this page, you have the option to add another recovery phone number or e-mail, if you want extra account security.</p>  <p>Type your birthdate, month, and year.</p> <p>Select your gender (optional).</p> <p>Click Next.</p>
9	<p>Google's <i>Terms of Service and Privacy Policy</i> appears on the next page.</p> <p>Read through some of the information, and once you are ready to move onto the next page, click once on the I agree button.</p> <p><i>Congratulations! You have successfully created a Google e-mail account.</i></p>
<p>E-mail Terminology</p>	<p>Inbox: The main space where e-mails that come to you will be stored.</p> <p>Attachment: Any file that is added to an e-mail message. Examples include: documents, images, .mp3 (song files), or .PDF.</p> <p>Drafts: E-mail messages that you have started to write but have not sent yet. Can be edited and sent at any time.</p> <p>Folders: A way to sort e-mails into categories, like “From Mom” or “About Technology”. These can be created by you and edited at any time.</p> <p>Contacts/Contact book: Displays list of people and organizations that you have e-mailed or been e-mailed by.</p> <p>Reply: The button that allows you to send an e-mail to someone who has e-mailed you.</p> <p>Reply All: The button that allows you to send an e-mail to everyone who received the e-mail, not just the sender.</p> <p>Forward: The button that allows you to share a message to another person, without having to write the e-mail yourself.</p> <p>To CC someone: Pronounced like “see-see”. A copy of the e-mail is sent to the recipient whose e-mail address appears in the message's Cc: header field.</p> <p>Spam: The location for storing unwanted e-mails as determined by a spam filter. Also called a “junk folder”.</p>
